Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ,

As I draw nearer to the wedding date, (April 23<sup>rd</sup>) the word ‘covenant’ continues to appear in my mind. In a marriage in the Episcopal Church, two people enter into a covenant with one another and a covenant with God. But, what exactly is a covenant? What is God’s covenant with us?

I will refrain from focusing on the multitude of covenants and various forms of covenant within Hebrew Scripture, except for that which was made in the 31<sup>st</sup> chapter of Jeremiah, when a completely new covenant was prophesied.

The word “covenant” comes out of the Hebrew word *Berith/Berit/Brit* which is commonly argued as an “agreement enacted between two parties in which one or both make promises under oath to perform or refrain from certain actions stipulated in advance.<sup>i</sup>”

For hundreds of years within Hebrew Scripture, the concept of covenant seemed to have been lost. However, in chapter 31 of Jeremiah a new covenant is prophesied. This prediction indicates a new covenant that God will create with God’s chosen people, a covenant that overshadows the covenant formed on Mt. Sinai. Following this new covenant, all shall know the Lord and God will “forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more” (Jer 31:34).

In Jesus Christ, we find the “new covenant” previously prophesied in the Old Testament being established with the early disciples at the Last Supper (Matt 26:26-29; Gospel parallels; 1 Cor 11:23-25). What is crucial to understand, is that the life, teachings and example of Jesus do not negate the old covenants established on Sinai or with Abraham and David, but instead fulfills them as well as establishing God’s permanent, everlasting covenant with humanity.

When it comes to understanding God’s new covenant established through Jesus, the Last Supper is crucial. Almost every NT tradition that speaks of the Eucharist includes Jesus sharing the cup of wine with his disciples and identifying this as the new covenant.<sup>ii</sup> These words and actions by Jesus connect us with God’s covenant prophesied in Jeremiah 31, and many earlier Christians understood the Eucharist as keeping an oath with Christ.

This covenant prophesied in Jeremiah was not a covenant established just for the Israelites/Jews unlike those made by God throughout the rest of Hebrew Scripture. This new covenant was a covenant that could be kept by anyone who put their faith and life in Jesus. This new covenant brought with it the understanding of a pluralistic community that cut through diverse backgrounds, allowing all to be welcomed and united by their commitment to Christ.<sup>iii</sup>

### MARK YOUR CALENDARS: BISHOP'S VISITATION AND CONFIRMATION IS JUNE 26<sup>TH</sup>!

On June 26<sup>th</sup>, our Diocesan Bishop, Bishop Russell Kendrick, will be with us at St. Francis. This is a great opportunity and moment in the life of our parish. On this date, the Bishop will confirm those who have been participating in the Confirmation class and wish to become **Confirmed Episcopalians**. Those who wish to be **Received** into the Episcopal Church or **Reaffirm their faith** can also do so on this date.

Please contact Chris Miller at the parish office and let her know if you intend on one of the following. If you are curious or have questions about any of these, please contact Fr. Tim.

**Confirmed:** An adult proclamation of a person's decision to draw closer to Christ and confirm their faith as a Christian through the Episcopal Church. A person is required to have been baptized (regardless of denomination), and to have attended a majority of the adult EpiscoChurch 101 course.

**Received:** If a person is confirmed in the following denominations: Catholic Church, Lutheran Church, Eastern Orthodox Church, and if they want to become identified as Episcopalians, they are not required to take the course (because they have been confirmed through a denomination of Apostolic succession – call Fr. Tim for details); and are simply 'received' into the Episcopal Denomination through the Bishop.

**Reaffirm:** If a person wants to reaffirm their faith, to make a public commitment (don't worry, no testimonies) that they desire to strengthen and deepen their relationship and devotion to Christ.

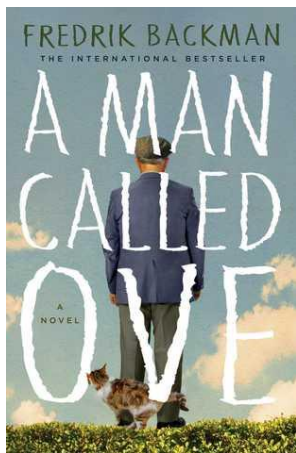

The first two months of 2016 have been good for St. Francis. At the end of February 2015, Net Income was \$384 and at the end of February 2016 Net Income is \$6,704. **EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS  
AND RESPONSE**

St. Francis of Assisi Parish remains a member of the Interfaith Disaster Resources Group, led by the City of Gulf Breeze. The experience from Hurricane Ivan made it clear that it would be more efficient and effective to share and improve existing facilities rather than developing duplicate shelters.

Having a larger generator, which we maintain, added to other facility improvements made in recent years, we remain a shelter facility which can be activated when needed due to weather conditions; primarily hurricanes.

St. Francis has an agreement with the city which allows us to use our facility to shelter our own parishioners, if necessary, prior to a storm, or following the storm. We further agreed, should space allow, to serve as a post-disaster temporary housing shelter for military and police relief workers. In the event that the use of the facilities is warranted, the City will provide shelter management, security, medical support and emergency supplies. We used part of a special financial gift to St. Francis to make our "sheltering capabilities" a bit more comfortable by purchasing twenty cots and twenty sleeping bags. Other churches have similar agreements with the city.

Next month, we will provide additional information to help St. Francis Parish be more ready to assist each other and the wider Gulf Breeze community. A small team is working to develop a detailed plan and set policies regarding disaster preparedness and response. ## RECOGNIZING MENTAL ILLNESS /ADDICTION

Every year, 25% of American adults experience a mental illness or addiction crisis. Mental illness is real, growing and deadly. No person or family is immune. Unfortunately, most people cannot recognize depression; manage a panic attack; or, respond effectively to a person considering suicide. If they could, odds are they might well save an at-risk friend, neighbor or family member. St. Francis is pleased to host a free Mental Health First Aid Certification course in our Parish Hall delivered by UWF's Mental & Behavioral Health Capacity Project. The eight-hour course will be offered in two, four-hour segments (May 2<sup>nd</sup> and May 4<sup>th</sup>) from 5 p.m. – 9 p.m. The class size is extremely limited and pre-registration is required. If interested, please contact Suzanne Clark at (850) 319-3828 or [sclarki@uwf.edu](mailto:sclarki@uwf.edu). Those who attend all eight hours of training are eligible for Mental Health First Aid certification, or, Nursing CE credits. You will receive information on anxiety, depression, trauma, psychosis, suicide and substance abuse. Ms. Clark will share a five-step action plan to enable you to help someone who is developing a mental health concern or is in crisis.
